



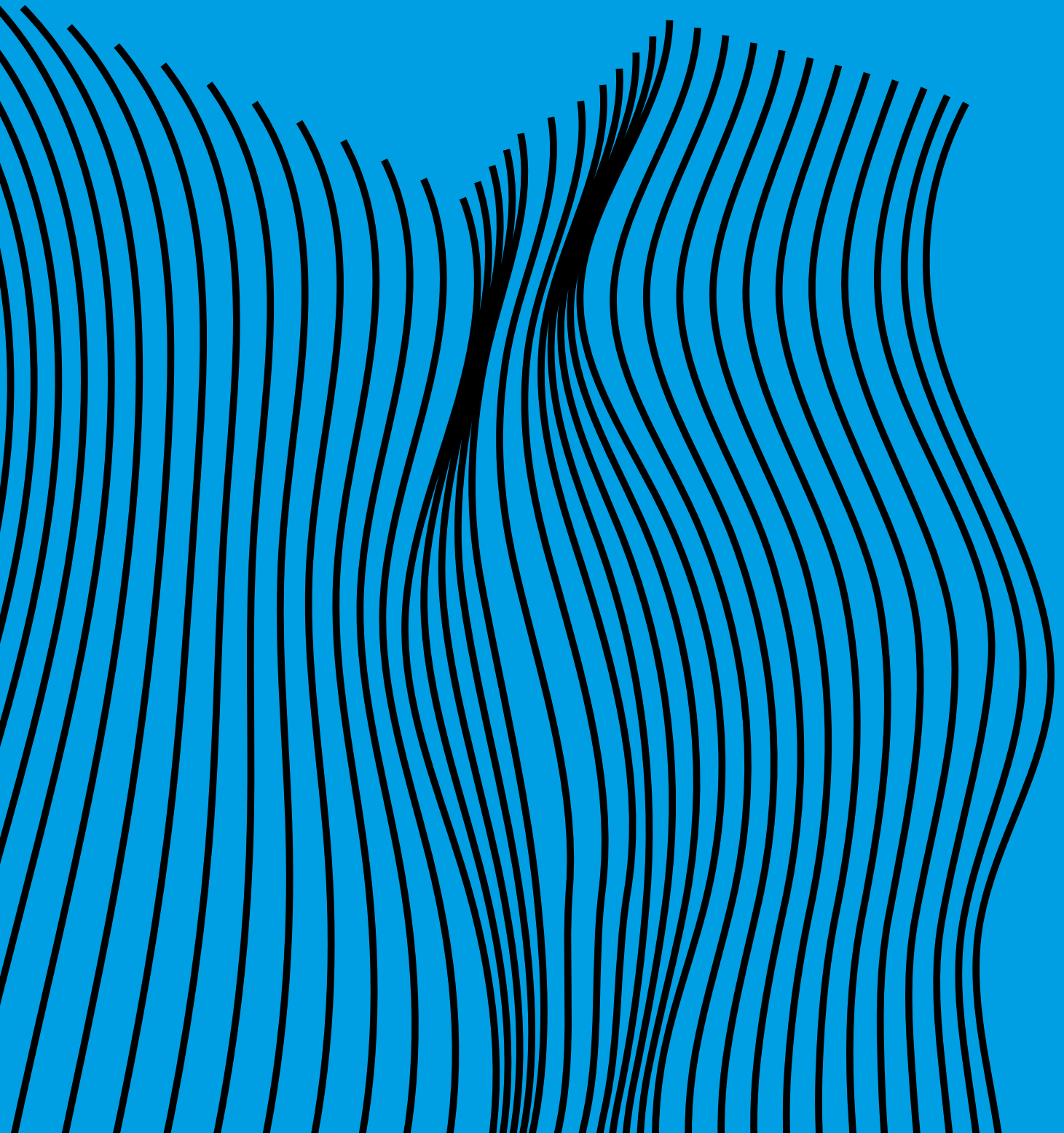

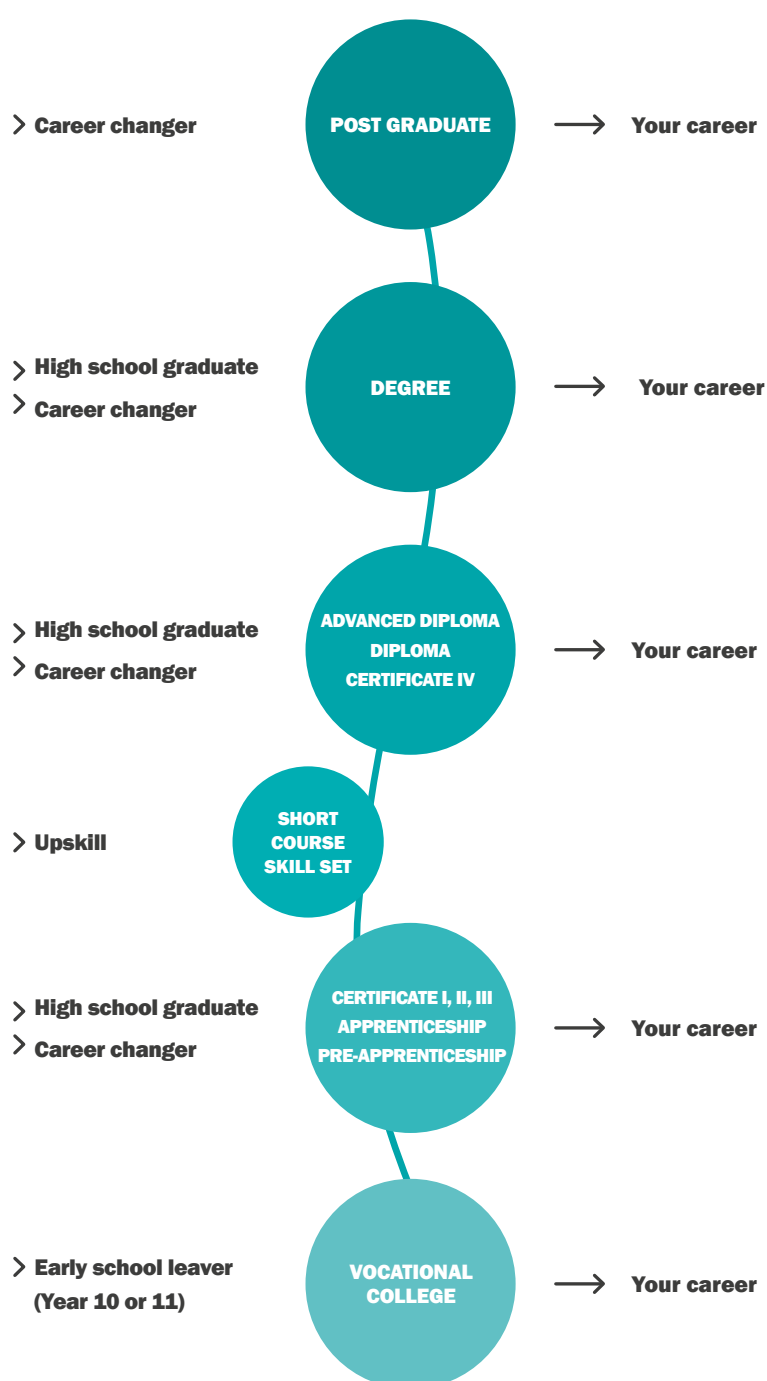

BOURKE STREET

The HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing is offered at this campus, which is perfect for those wanting to learn in the CBD.

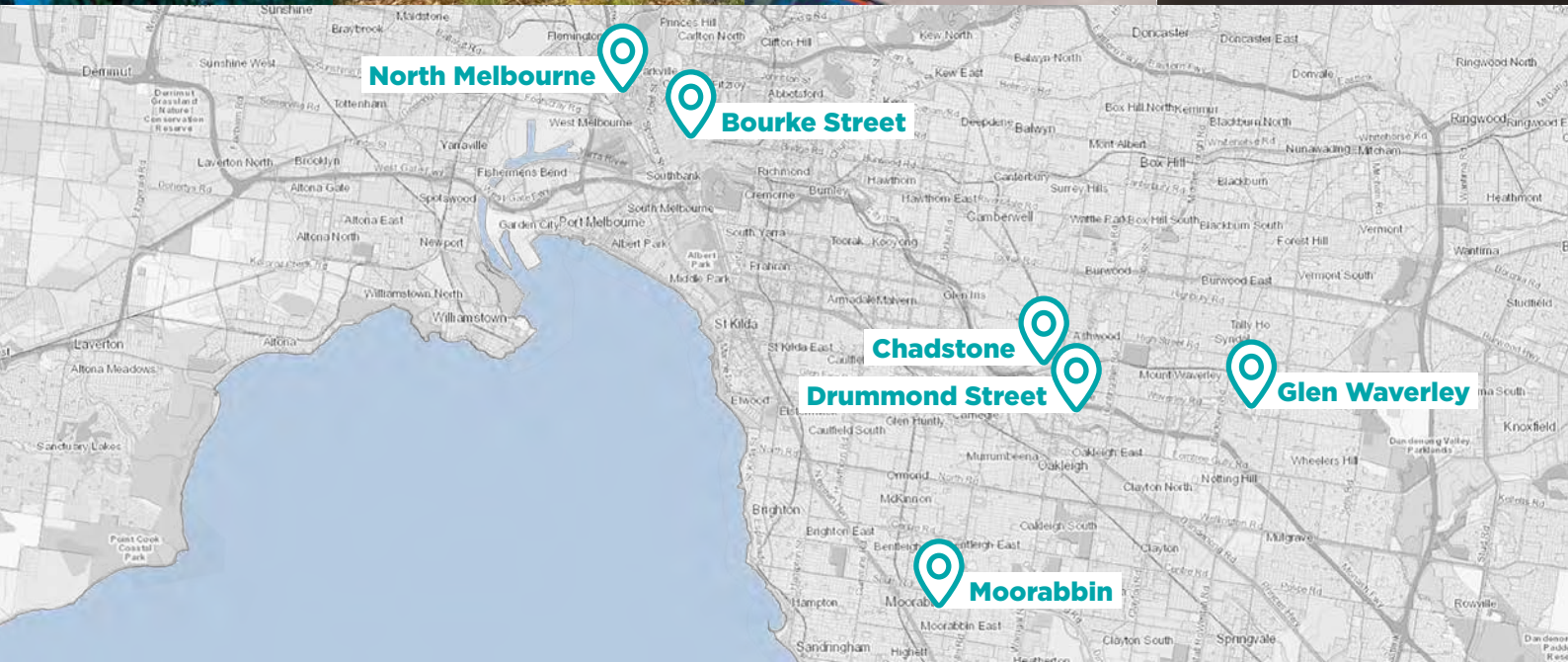

Counselling

Apprenticeships and Traineeships

Considering a trades career? Holmesglen can get you started on a rewarding journey.

Our apprenticeship courses emphasise hands-on learning in real-world training environments, allowing you to apply your skills from day one. With strong industry ties, we ensure our apprentices receive the most current and future-relevant training.

Apprenticeships and Traineeships are a three-sided agreement between you, your employer and a training organisation. That means you must find a job as an apprentice and sign a training contract with them before you start study. The study part of an apprenticeship can work a number of ways including blended delivery (workshop, on-site or online).

Once you complete your apprenticeship, you will hold a nationally recognised qualification.

The best part about an apprenticeship?

You'll get paid to work while you're studying.

Pre-apprenticeship

A pre-apprenticeship (or pre-app) is your introduction to a potential trades career. It helps you learn fundamental skills without the commitment of longer training. That way you can decide whether an apprenticeship is something you will then want to pursue.

Course Fees

Full fees

You will be a full fee-paying student if you do not meet concession or subsidised fee criteria, or if you are an international student.

Subsidised fees

If you're an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or a holder of a permanent visa or humanitarian visa, you may be eligible for a government-subsidised place.

Concession fees

If you're a current healthcare, pension card or veteran gold card holder and you're applying for a certificate course, then concession fees may apply to you. Your concession eligibility will be calculated during your enrolment.

Material and Activities fees

Material and ancillary fees include essential materials, activities, excursions, uniforms, equipment and/or other related fees required to complete your course. They are in addition to your course fees and are not subject to concessions.

What types of fees apply to me?

Services Fee

VET students pay a General Services Fee (GSF) and Higher Education students pay a Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF). This per-semester services fee contributes to student services including counselling, welfare, learning support and student-led organisations.

How can I pay?



Upfront

You are required to pay your fees or confirm a payment method before the commencement of your first class.

- In person at any Holmesglen campus Information Office
- Online via the student account section on the student portal
- By cheque
- Third party invoice through the presentation of an authorisation in writing at any Holmesglen campus Information Office.
- BPAY via an invoice which will contain your BPAY details.



Payment plan

You can organise to pay in instalments over the duration of your course.

Scholarship

You can apply for a number of scholarships that may assist in paying your tuition fees.



VET Student Loan

If you're studying selected diplomas or advanced diplomas, you may be able to apply for a loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary once you start earning over a certain amount).



FEE-HELP

If you're studying a degree program that does not offer HECS-HELP, you may be able to apply for a FEE-HELP loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary after you start earning over a certain amount).



HECS-HELP

If you're studying a Bachelor of Nursing, you may be able to apply for a loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary once you start earning over a certain amount).

Holmesglen staff will contact you to send you a literacy and numeracy assessment, organise your interview and confirm your pre-training assessments.

Register with an Australian Apprenticeship Support Network (AASN) and nominate Holmesglen as your training provider (your employer will usually do this for you).

It is recommended that you use a Holmesglen approved education agent to assist you with your application. They can help you choose the right course and assist you with your student visa application. To find an agent in your country, visit holmesglen.edu.au/international

Receive and accept your Letter of Offer.

Receive your AASN registration number, which is called an 'Epsilon Number'.

Whether you're applying with or without an agent, you'll need to check that you meet all academic and English prerequisites as listed on the international course pages.

You'll also need to provide certified copies of your supporting documents. For details on how to apply, visit holmesglen.edu.au/International/How-to-apply/

Complete government required information and register.

Holmesglen staff will contact you to arrange your training schedule and finalise your Holmesglen enrolment (once your AASN registration is complete and you have received your 'Epsilon Number').

Make sure that you read and understand the Institute's Terms and Conditions of Enrolment and the Fee Payment and Refund Procedure. Complete all sections of the application form, and remember to include your signature and contact details.

If you're applying without an agent, you'll be required to pay a \$500 (AUD) application fee.



5

Pay your fees (see page 16 for payment options).

Pay your fees (either upfront or on a payment plan).

Once our admissions officers have all the required information to assess your application, they'll inform you of the outcome.

If you're successful, you will receive a Letter of Offer along with a Fee Schedule, outlining the fees payable.

Find out if you are eligible for a government-subsidised place and fee concession, show 100 points of ID to receive your student ID card.

Show 100 points of ID to receive your student ID card.

If you have met all the conditions on your Letter of Offer, you can proceed to deposit your first fee instalment, as outlined in your Letter of Offer (Fee Schedule). Submit your payment, along with your Offer Acceptance Form, to receive an Electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE). You will need an eCoE to apply for a student visa. Certificate II in Apparel, Fashion and Textiles

VET Delivered to Secondary Students

MST20722 **Part time (2 years)** **February** **Chadstone**

Entry requirements: You must be enrolled as a VCE or VCE (Vocational Major) student at a Victorian secondary school.

Career opportunities: Upon graduation, learners may gain employment into entry level positions such as product sourcing and retail/online sales. This course may assist in creating a portfolio for further study.

Certificate II in Apparel, Fashion and Textiles

MST20722 **Full time (6 months), part time (1 year)** **February** **Chadstone**

Entry requirements: Minimum age requirement 17 years and must have completed Year 11.

Career opportunities: Designer, production assistant, machinist, quality control, wholesale, product sourcing and retail/online sales.

Certificate IV in Apparel and Fashion

MST40222 **Full time (1 year), part time (2 years)** **February, July** **Chadstone**

Entry requirements: Minimum age requirement 17 years and must have completed Year 11.

Bachelor of Fashion Design

BFD23 **Full time (3 years), part time (6 years)** **March, August** **Chadstone**

This is a cutting-edge course for those who aspire to a career in the fast-paced world of fashion. Innovative design is at the forefront of our delivery, underpinned by a comprehensive technical foundation in pattern engineering, garment construction and the application of CAD design tools. Our fashion design course also has a strong focus on environmental and social impacts. Throughout the degree, you will understand the importance of sustainability and circular fashion through capstone projects, work-integrated learning, and ethical and sustainable practice units. You may even showcase your latest collection at Melbourne Fashion Week's annual Student Runway – a major opportunity for the next generation of fashion designers.

Entry requirements: Students must be at least 17 years old at the start of the course and hold a minimum qualification of VCE/HSC or an equivalent for entry. All applicants are required to attend an interview to present a few images of their creative work/s.

Career opportunities: Fashion designer/design assistant, manual pattern maker and grader, CAD pattern maker and grader, production manager, garment technician and fit technologist, small (design) business manager/owner, independent fashion consultant/designer, fashion events producer.
